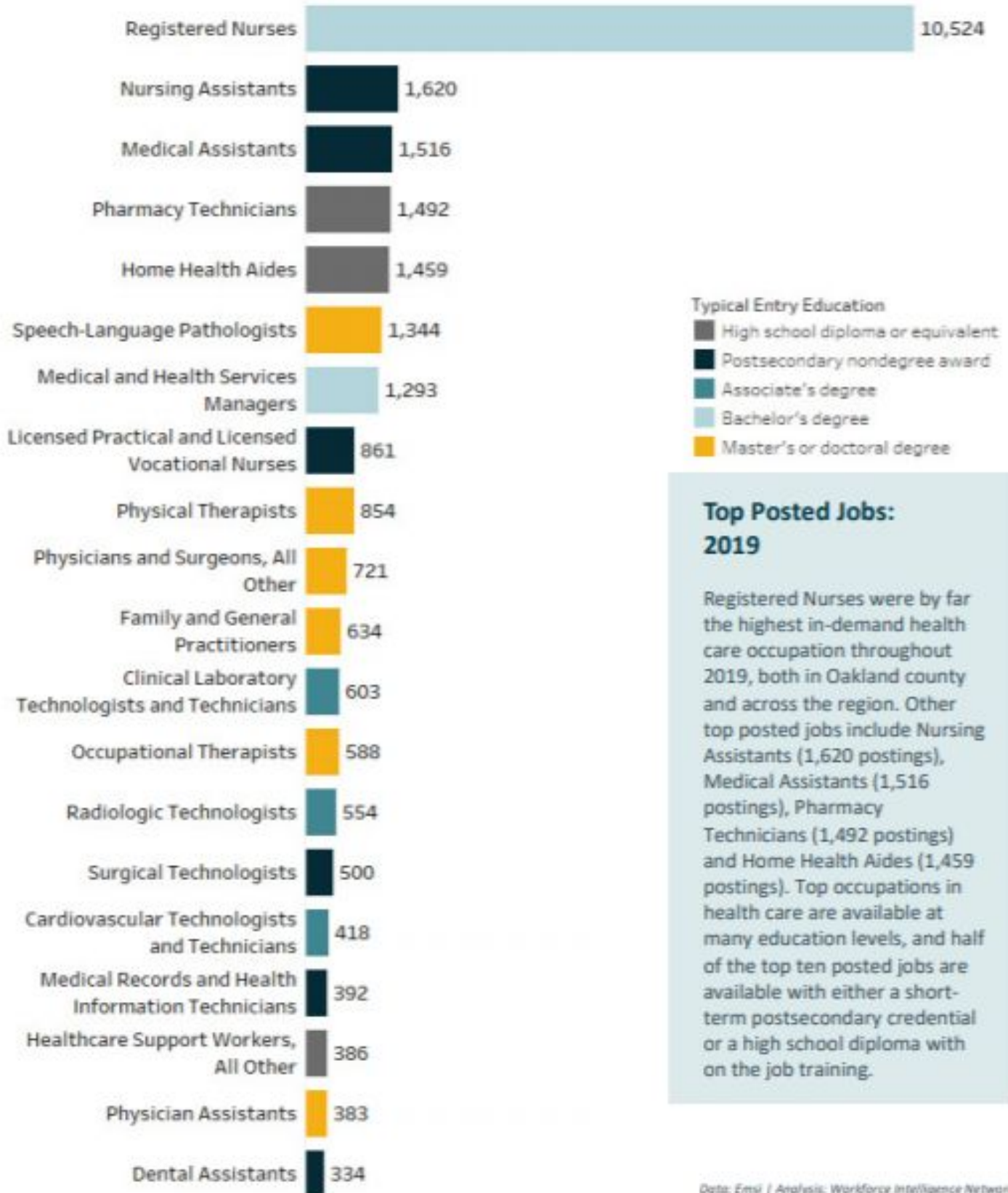

Health Care Top Posted Jobs 2019



Top Posted Jobs: 2019

Registered Nurses were by far the highest in-demand health care occupation throughout 2019, both in Oakland county and across the region. Other top posted jobs include Nursing Assistants (1,620 postings), Medical Assistants (1,516 postings), Pharmacy Technicians (1,492 postings) and Home Health Aides (1,459 postings). Top occupations in health care are available at many education levels, and half of the top ten posted jobs are available with either a short-term postsecondary credential or a high school diploma with on the job training.
